EVENT CONCEPT

The FINA Virtual Artistic Swimming World Series was jointly presented to the FINA Technical Artistic Swimming Committee by USA and Canada as a way to schedule some Artistic Swimming World Series events that can be guaranteed to take place in the midst of the global COVID-19 pandemic.

The concept is to present, via webcast, a virtual event featuring previously filmed videos of routines from federations around the world. The videos will be sent in in advance by federations and judged by a full panel of international FINA judges in advance of the webcast dates. The final webcast events will feature the routine videos with all scores as well as sport presentation and commentary.

EVENT RULES

Rules	As an event of the FINA Artistic Swimming World Series, the competition will be organized according to FINA ASWS Regulations		
Category	Senior	Senior	
Participation	Open to National Teams from all FINA Federations and also open to clubs with the agreement of the concerned Federation.		
Routines	Technical Female Solo, Male Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team	Free Female Solo, Male Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team, Combination, Highlight	
Entries	Every federation may enter 4 solos technical, 4 solos free, 4 duets technical, 4 duets free, 4 mixed duets technical, 4 mixed duets free, 1 team technical, 1 team free, 1 combination and 1 highlight. Every swimmer is allowed to compete in 1 solo technical, 1 solo free, 1 duet/mixed duet technical, 1 duet/mixed duet free, 1 team technical, 1 team free, 1 combination and 1 highlight team. Male solos will not be a part of the Series, will not count for points and should registered separately (see below).		
Competition Format	There will be no preliminary events. Finals will be held for all events. The events are to be held separately and the results cannot be combined.		
Time Limits	According to FINA Rules (AS 14).		
Draws	Done electronically and posted on FINA website according to FINA rules (AS 13.7).		
Scoring	Scoring will be according to the FINA Rules (AS 17)		
Solo Elements	The elements will be the same for both male and female technical solo routines.

Reserve Athlete	Federations may submit an reserve athlete substitution to scorer Ted Smith (smitty.

ENTRIES

- Every FINA National Federation is allowed to compete (this does not apply to suspended National Federations).
- Should a National Federation enter several solos, duets, mixed duets or team events with members of their national delegation, only the highest ranked solos, duets, mixed duets or team in each event will be considered for the Series' results and rankings. The National Federations may enter different athletes in the solo, duet, mixed duet and team events of the various legs of the Series they wish to take part in.
- For World Series only, it is possible to have up to two (2) male swimmers as part of the team in the highlight and free combination events.
- All Federations participating in the competitions of the World Series must be registered by their National Federation in the FINA GMS in accordance with the deadlines. As mentioned above, National Federations may enter more than one solo, duet, mixed duet and/or team. In this case, they will be identified numerically. E.g. AUT 1, AUT 2, AUT 3, etc.
- Entries are to be submitted through the GMS according to the deadlines for National Federations, except for male solo entries which should be registered directly through OC by contacting Stéphane Côté at stephane@artisticswimming.ca.

The above rules can be found in the FINA Rules & Regulations.

Eligibility	Every participating Federation must provide an A or a G judge to every meet they enter, up to a maximum of two (2) judges. The A or G judge must have successfully passed the Judges Exam administered at a FINA Artistic Swimming Judges Certification School, the online annual exam and be on the current FINA List. The list of judges for each competition should be sent in advance to FINA	
Registration	All judges need to register though the FINA GMS System. Conflict of interest form must be submitted to FINA by April 18, 2021. Late submissions will not be accepted. Judges will also be asked to fill out an information & confidentiality agreement form that will be forwarded to them after their registration is completed.	
Practice Judges	Because of the complicated technical nature of our virtual events, no practice judges will be allowed for this event.	
Neutral Judges	In the event of low foreign participation in a ASWS Leg FINA will appoint one (1) to two (2) neutral judges to ensure a balance between the judges' nationalities, at FINA's expense. Federations may apply to send one (1) neutral judge per ASWS event at their own expense.	
Computer and Connection	Must use a desktop or laptop computer running an operating system that allows for streaming video and be comfortable using it without supervision.	
	Tablets and mobile phones are NOT permitted for judging videos	
	The computer or laptop must have a physical connection to the internet using all ethernet cable. A wireless connection is not suitable for streaming routine video

MANDATORY JUDGE INFORMATION & TRAINING MEETING

The mandatory Judge Meeting & Training will be April 23, 2021 at 10:00 AM EDT. Every nominated judge is required to attend this meeting. The meeting will be approximately 2.5 hours long, including information, training as well as a full judging simulation practice. It will take place on the zoom platform at a link that will be provided to all the selected officials.

Prior to the mandatory Judge meeting, each official will be required to create an account on the Integrated Sports Systems (ISS) U-Judge system. Further instructions regarding the creation of the account and the testing of the Internet connection will be provided later to all selected officials.





VIDEO CAPTURE INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

Routine Video	A full video of each routine must be filmed, without interruption, using filming guidelines below. The video must be non-edited (continuous) and include a full walk-on and must also capture all the athletes getting out of the water and get back up to the starting platform, just like in a regular competition. Once back on the start deck, athletes should stay in position and wave to the camera for at least 20 seconds.	
	Whenever possible, videos should be filmed inside, to avoid the glare that comes with exterior pools. It is strongly encouraged that you test out your camera and sound equipment prior to recording your routine to ensure you are capturing the best video and sound quality.	
Performance Window	In order to simulate an on-demand competition environment, the video must be filmed within an allowed filming window (see information below).	
Presentation Video	A 60-second presentation video will also need to be captured for each routine entered. This video might be used before or after the routines and will simply be a static shot of all the athletes competing in the routine standing in full suit, makeup and hairup and waving to the camera/crowd.	
Video Resolution	All videos must be captured at a resolution of 1080p HD, at 30 frames per second (fps).	
Position for Filming	The person in charge of capturing the video should be at the side of the pool, exactly in the middle (at 12.5m for 25 m pools), 1-3m from the water edge, with the starting platform to their right. The camera should be elevated to 1.8m (6 ft) from the ground, which is the average height from which judges watch routines.	
Zooming	Zooming during the routine is allowed but should be used carefully to make sure all athletes are always visible during the entire routine. The basic idea should always be to make your routine look its best.	
	It's also important that your recording angle is not so wide that it becomes impossible to view the athletes properly. If you can see the entire width of the field of play when you start, you have probably zoomed out too much. A good basic starting point is to set up your camera so that the middle of the pool is at left-most edge of the video and the starting position at the right-most edge. You can then adjust zoom appropriately from there. as the routine unfolds.	
Suggested Equipment	A high-resolution camera is highly recommended in order to ensure quality and ability to zoom. Camera should be mounted on a tripod to ensure stability. Most common DSLR cameras will allow you to capture the quality needed for this event. Cell phones, tablets and GoPros are NOT recommended. It may also be worthwhile to rent a camera or hire a professional videographer.	
Sound	It is recommended that sound be fed directly into the camera by a cable to ensure best sound. If your camera has a mini-XLR input, use a mini-XLR to XLR cable to connect your camera to your sound mixer. If your camera has a 3.5mm input, use a 3.5mm to CLR cable to connect to your mixer. Be sure to check that the volume level from the mixer is not too loud for the camera. Most cameras have an informational display for sound level.	
Pool Deck	The pool deck should be free of any removable objects such as training equipment, bags, towels, etc.	
Other Mandatory Considerations	Videos that do not meet the minimum requirements will not be accepted for entry to the competition. Federations will be notified and may be given the opportunity to re-submit within an additional defined performance window, time-permitting.	
	At a minimum, all these requirements must be met: Video must be filmed in landscape mode (horizontal) All limbs of all athletes on the screen at all times NO talking or noise must be heard other than the music (ideally, music should be fed directly into the recording equipment) NO major glare which would prevent judges from accurately judging the routine should be present	





PERFORMANCE WINDOW & VIDEO SUBMISSION

What is the performance window?	A 60-minute period, pre-selected by each federation on the established competition days, within which the routine must be performed and filmed, and submitted to the independent production company supplied by the Organizing Committee.
Confirming Performance Windows	The form to confirm the chosen performance windows is <i>available on the event page</i> and must be submitted before April 18, 2021. Performances can be scheduled any time during this window, but not outside of it.
Submitting Videos	The performance videos must be uploaded to our independant production partner using the link that will be provided to participating federations.
	The upload must begin within the alloted one-hour window, and any issues with the upload attempt must be reported within that timeframe to Stepahne Cote at stephane@artisticswimming.ca .
Identification Codes	A special code will be delivered to you one hour before the start of your selected performance window. This code will need to be written on a sheet of paper and held in front of the camera at the beginning (before the full walk on) and end (after everyone has been filmed getting out of the water and has gone back on the start platform) of your continuous, non-edited video.

SPORT PRESENTATION

Every participation National Federation is required to inform the LOC of the following information, using the <u>form</u> available on the event page:

- Short presentation of the athletes and the coach
- Explain the choice of music and its meaning to the athlete(s)
- Solo, duet or team's best achievements
- Solo, duet or team's goals for this event and goals for the future
- For solo and duet: give some information about the athletes (studies, main interests)
- Please provide at least one fun fact about the swimmers, the team and/or the coach.

This information will be used by the commentators after the routines and will help the audience to connect with the athletes. You are kindly requested to send one (1) package per Federation with the forms labelled: **Country code_year_event**

The information sent to us will be stored by FINA to be used by each LOC of the Series. Should your information change (choice of music for example) please send us a new form so that the information can be updated for the next organisers.

GALA ROUTINES

An Exhibition Gala will be presented at the end of the broadcast. All delegations are asked to participate in this final gala as it is one of the main ways to develop and promote our sport. Solo, duet, trio, accessories, improvisations, make up - everything is allowed to make this Exhibition Gala a spectacular show to finish the event.

Please plan for and Exhibition Gala Show routine which is different from the competition routines and lasts a maximum of 2 minutes. The deadline to upload this routine and to submit the Gala Information Form is May 9, 2021.

Please make sure to include your Country Code in the label of your gala video file and upload it by the deadline <u>using</u> this upload link.
