



The host may enter an additional diver to compete in the Individual Events to a maximum of 3. Only the top 2 divers per National Federation can progress to the Final. No additional divers can be added for the Synchronised and Team Events.

5.2 Individual Events Rounds

The Individual competitions comprise 3m Springboard and 10m Platform for both men and women. The tournament system is the format for the individual competition, based only on dives with an unlimited degree of difficulty (6 dives for men and 5 dives for women).

- All divers will take part in 2 split-preliminary rounds
- The preliminary start list will be determined through a random draw by the appointed timekeeper
- The top 12 divers from the merged results of the 2 preliminary rounds will participate in the Final

5.3 Synchronised Events Rounds

The Synchronised diving competitions comprise 3m Springboard and 10m Platform for both men and women.

- The start list will be determined through a random draw by the appointed timekeeper
- Competitions to be held as a direct Final

The finals comprise 6 dives for men and 5 dives for women, of which the first two (2) rounds of dives have an assigned Degree of Difficulty of 2.0 for each dive regardless of the formula. The remaining rounds are without limit of Degree of Difficulty. All forward-facing dives on springboard shall be done with a running approach.

5.4 Team Event Rounds

The Team Event diving competition consists of at least 1 female and 1 male diver but no more than 4 divers.

- The start list will be determined through a random draw by the appointed timekeeper
- Competitions to be held as a direct Final

2 dives shall be executed by the female competitor and 2 dives by the male competitor. 2 dives shall be executed by a mixed synchronised team of 1 male and 1 female diver. 3 dives shall be executed from the 3m springboard and the other 3 dives from the 10m platform. The following rounds will be performed.

Round 1: female diver from the 3m springboard

Round 2: male diver from the 3m springboard

Round 3: mixed synchronised team (1 female and 1 male diver) from the 3m springboard

Round 4: female diver from the 10m platform

Round 5: male diver from the 10m platform

Round 6: mixed synchronised team (1 female and 1 male diver) from the 10m platform

6. SCORING

7 judges are used for Individual and Team competitions and scores should be calculated according to FINA Diving Rules *D 7.5*. 11 judges are used for synchronised competition and scores should be calculated according to FINA Diving Rules *D 7.7*.

In the event of a tie all divers go to the Final. In the event of a tie in the Final all divers will receive the Prize Money.



7. SWIMWEAR AND ADVERTISING

Identification in the form of logos on swimwear and pool deck equipment, i.e. track suits, official's uniforms, footwear, towels and bags, is permitted in accordance with regulations established in the [By-Laws](#) (BL 7). A two-piece swimsuit shall, in relation to advertising, be regarded as one. The name and the flag of the country of the competitor or the country code shall not be regarded as advertisements. (GR 6.1).

Body advertisement is not allowed in any way whatsoever. (GR 6.2). Advertising for tobacco or alcohol is not allowed. (GR 6.3) Advertising identification appearing on swimwear, pool deck equipment is permitted as established in the By-Laws (BL 7).

Any advertising identifications which are not indicated in these regulations are not permitted. If any clothing or other items of equipment contravenes these regulations, the competitor must immediately remove the offending item(s) and replace it/them with clothing that complies with FINA rules. If the breach is not immediately remedied the competitor may be requested to wear attire provided by the event organizer. (BL 7.1.7)

FINA reserves the right to request Federations taking part in FINA Competitions to present any advertising identification in this rule for examination and approval of FINA prior to the event in question. (BL 7.1.8)

8. DOPING CONTROL

The doping control will be coordinated by International Testing Agency (ITA) during the FINA Diving World Cup 2022.

9. PRIZE MONEY

Prize Money will be offered to a net total amount of USD 159'000.

The top 6 places from the Individual Events will receive Prize Money.

The top 3 places from the Synchronised and Team events will receive Prize Money.

1 st place	USD	6,000
2 nd place	USD	5,000
3 rd place	USD	4,000
4 th place	USD	3,000
5 th place	USD	2,000
6 th place	USD	1,000

Prize Money will be distributed by the FINA Office after the conclusion of the Event and after final clearance of FINA's Doping Control Department.

In case of tie in score points, tied athletes have the same rank. The next placed athlete/s will be moved further down accordingly.

10. TRAVEL & ACCOMMODATION SUPPORT

Financial support to the participating divers will be provided using the following principles:



Principles:

- Divers that made the Individual Semi-Finals at either the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games or Budapest 2022 World Championships will be eligible to receive flight and accommodation support. Up to 80 divers will be supported
- Only divers who performed in at least one Individual Event will be eligible to benefit from this support
- If a diver participates in an Individual Event and as well in a Synchronised or Team Event, they shall receive support as Individual diver only
- FINA will not be providing support to coaches, team leaders and/or other members of the teams.
- Participants not covered under these principles shall cover their own expenses in accordance with the Event Bulletin
- The support will be transferred to the relevant National Federations upon the end of the event

Flight support:

- Divers traveling from the Americas, Asia or Oceania to Berlin will get USD 1,000
- Divers traveling from Africa to Berlin will get USD 800
- Divers traveling from Europe to Berlin will get USD 200

Accommodation:

- The Organising Committee will provide Full Board accommodation as per the above principles.

11. VISA

The Organising Committee will make best efforts with its government regarding entry visas for all competitors and team officials from any National FINA Member Federation, as well as for FINA officials and Media attending the Event.

12. REGISTRATION

All National Federation registration and entries will take place through the FINA General Management System (GMS) via <https://data.fina.org>. Each National Federation will access the system to complete their registrations of athletes and officials before the designated deadline of **29 September 2022**. The Organising Committee is not obliged to guarantee or provide any logistical assistance for those delegations that do not meet the deadline.

13. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Local transportation, including the transfer between the official arrival port and the official hotel, will be provided by the Organising Committee provided that the participating teams stay in the official hotel(s). All participating FINA Member Federations shall ensure that correct and up-to-date travel information is entered in the FINA GMS.

14. DELEGATES, TECHNICAL OFFICIALS & JUDGES

FINA Representatives: FINA will nominate Technical Delegates (FINA TDC Commission: Bureau Liaison, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Honorary Secretary) and members of FINA Staff. FINA will cover their travel expenses to and from the Event. The Organising Committee is responsible for all accommodation, meals and local transportation costs of these FINA Representatives as set out herein.

Technical Delegate: The FINA TDC Commission will submit written reports to FINA, covering the administration and conduct of the Event, including the official hotels, meals and dining facilities, transportation, Venue and competition facilities, protocol, etc.

The Technical Delegate shall conduct judging evaluations and shall present a written report and



summary of evaluations to the FINA TDC Member responsible for the compilation of judging evaluations.

Technical Officials: FINA shall appoint the Technical Officials. All other officials, marshals and other persons required shall be recruited and appointed by the Organising Committee.

Judges: There shall be 15 Judges at the Event. FINA shall appoint 15 of the Judges and the Organising Committee shall nominate 1 referee, whose appointment shall be subject to FINA's approval.

FINA Office: The Organising Committee shall provide an office at the venue for use by the FINA Delegates and FINA representatives, with a computer, internet connection, a photocopier and printer, a suitable number of chairs and desks and such other items as FINA requests before the competition.

15. MEDICAL

The Organising Committee shall provide the following First Aid, and medical services:

- Appointment of a suitable qualified Event medical officer/doctor.
- Free medical service for all competitors and officials at the Event venue.
- First aid facilities at the official hotels.
- Ambulance on permanent standby at the competition/training venue.
- Designation of a local hospital and provision of information to teams on local doctors, pharmacies, dentists, *etc.*
- Rooms for Massage services at the official hotels and competition Venue.

16. INSURANCE

The Organising Committee shall secure and maintain, at its cost, an adequate general liability insurance with a recognised and financially secure insurance company, covering the risks required by FINA relating to the hosting and staging of the Event. FINA has a right to approve such insurance and to be a co-insured party on the relevant policy.

General Liability Insurance: The Organising Committee shall secure and maintain, before the beginning of the Event and one (1) month after the end of the Event, at its own cost, an adequate general liability insurance policy with a well-recognized and financially secure insurance company covering the risks related to the planning, hosting and staging of the Event. The insured value should be not less than one million United States dollars (USD 1'000'000) or equivalent in local currency. The policies should include the World Wide Jurisdiction clause. The athletes and the delegation of the participating federations shall be included in the coverage. Any warranty or special endorsement related with this group shall be submitted to FINA for its prior written approval. The Organising Committee shall designate and maintain FINA as an additional insured party in all policies of insurance. Upon request, the Organising Committee shall provide FINA a copy of its certificate of insurance outlining the insurance coverage set out above.

Event Insurance: In addition, it is mandatory for the Organising Committee to secure and maintain, at its own cost, an adequate event insurance policy with a well-recognized and financially secured insurance company. The insured value should be not less than 75% of the Budget amount. The Organising Committee shall designate and maintain FINA as an additional insured party in all policies of insurance. Upon request, the Organising Committee shall provide FINA a copy of its certificate of insurance outlining the insurance coverage set out above.
