Emblem

The Event emblem is a symbol representing a combination of "F" for Fukuoka and an image of aquatic sports, an easy-to-understand pictogram for everyone around the world. The symbol, which depicts human heads and arms to express the energetic movements of the six aquatic sports disciplines, represents a medal ceremony podium to honour the world's top athletes.

The emblem for the Masters Championships, which is pale orange, has more round-tipped arms and gives a warmer impression.

Inspired by Fukuoka's ocean-front location, dolphins, well known as a popular sea animal, were chosen for the design motif.

The mascots' human-like characteristics will boost the momentum of the Championships.



2.3.1 Venue Overview

Marine Messe Fukuoka Hall B is a brand-new facility, which only opened in spring 2021. The multi-purpose convention centre is located next to Marine Messe Fukuoka Hall A, the venue for the Swimming and Artistic Swimming events.





2.3.2 First Aid and Athletes Medical Services

The organising committee of the World Aquatics Championships – Fukuoka 2023 will organise medical care to cover any emergency issues, acute injuries and illnesses of athletes and Team AQUA that may occur during the period of the World Aquatics Events and to respond to injuries and illness that arise to any one at the competition and non-competition venues.

However it is important to remind that each accredited participant (including athletes) shall have their own personal medical and repatriation insurance.

Limits

Chronic injury and illness are not covered by the LOC Medical Services and World Aquatics is not responsible for any failure to diagnose or treat any chronic injury or illness.

Date of Operations

Athlete medical services must be provided on all days of official training and competition, beginning 30 minutes before training or competition begins.

Activities of Teams' Medical Personnel

Teams' Medical Personnel are entitled to provide medical assistance only to the members of their respective delegations.

All doctors should be reminded of the strict protocol of the Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) provisions to be followed in the event any athlete requires medication that falls under the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Prohibited List. Under such circumstances, medical justification in full compliance with the International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions will be mandatory and must be communicated to the International Testing Agency (ITA) at tue@ita.sport.

Teams' Medical Personnel should also be reminded of the strict conditions governing the intravenous route of administration of any substance for clinical purposes. Information regarding these can be found on the websites of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), International Testing Agency (ITA) and Aquatics Integrity Unit (AQIU). www.wada-ama.org

It is recommended that NF healthcare professionals inform their insurance company that they are travelling abroad with a sports team, and check whether their professional liability insurance covers this activity. Each NF should make its own arrangements for professional liability insurance.

Venues and Facilities

Medical Services

During the World Aquatics Championships, timely medical services will be provided to participants at a designated hospital. In addition, first aid and simple treatment will be available at medical rooms (competition venues) and medical desks (training venues).

a) Access to Medical Facilities

During the World Aquatics Championships, access to the venue medical rooms will be provided exclusively to medical staff, athletes, coaches, team managers, and the members of the Team AQUA with appropriate accreditation accesses.

b) Competition / Training Venues

The hospitals in the vicinity of the competition venue will act as designated hospitals for the World Aquatics Championships. Patients who need more than first aid will be transferred to one of these hospitals for further treatment.

Competition Venue Medical Rooms

A medical room will be operated at each competition venue. Medical rooms will be equipped with pharmaceutical drugs and medical devices including first aid kits with two (2) basic instruments, oxygen inhalers, and AEDs. Medical staff such as doctors and nurses will provide appropriate medical services during the competition and training periods. In case of an emergency, patients will be transferred to designated hospitals after receiving first aid.

Training Venue Medical Desks

During the official training periods, medical desks with nurses will be operated at the training venues. In case of an emergency, patients will be transferred to a designated hospitals after receiving first aid.

c) Emergency Transport

119 Rescue Service will be provided, and designated hospitals will be arranged. While in an ambulance, nurse(s) and paramedic(s) will attend to the patient. Transportation routes from each competition/training venue to hospitals are established, along with a timely communication system between venues and designated hospitals. When a patient is being transported to a designated hospital, his/her team doctor or team official shall accompany and take care of the patient.

Medical Expenses, Insurance & Liability

Each accredited participant (athlete, officials, coaches, etc.) shall have their own personal medical insurance that covers health care and repatriation in Japan.

The Organising Committee has the responsibility to provide, at minimum, first aid medical care during the World Aquatics Championships.

Athletes, Technical Officials and Team AQUA Members are covered by World Aquatics Insurance. However this is a travel insurance (not a health insurance) covering emergency medical expenses in a subsidiary and complementary way. Therefore, a personal insurance is necessary.

Information about COVID-19

a) Entry Requirements

Since 29 April 2023, all border measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 have been lifted. Those entering Japan on or after 29 April 2023, are not required to present a valid Vaccination Certificate or a Covid-19 Negative Test Certificate.

b) Measures in case of positive test

Since 8 May 2023, isolation has no longer been a legal requirement for anyone diagnosed with COVID-19 in Japan.

Nevertheless, participants who test positive during the Event are encouraged not to come to the venue to compete or work, and to wear a mask (FFP2, KN95 or equivalent) until the end of the symptoms. They must limit their social interaction with other people.

Each team shall take the necessary measures to organise the meals and accommodation of the member of their team who tested positive.

c) Do I need to tell the hotel?

YES. For protection of the staff at your hotel, you must inform the hotel when a member of your delegation has tested positive, so that procedures can be put in place that, whilst ensuring the positive participant is comfortable and safe, protects the staff from infection.

d) Medical Follow-up

You should not hesitate to contact the LOC Medical Team to get medical advice and follow-up.

2.3.3 Athletes Changing Rooms

There are four (4) changing rooms at the competition venue. Changing rooms may be used by several teams so each team must place its athletes' and team's belongings in a single bag/box. Team Leaders are responsible for locking and unlocking their bags/boxes.

2.3.4 Athletes and Team Officials Lounge Area

A rest area will be available for athletes and team officials at the competition venue during competition days.

2.3.5 Athletes and Team Officials Seating

At the competition pool, seating in the stands will be available for athletes and accredited team officials.

2.3.6 Sports information Desks

Sport Information Desks will operate at the entrance of each competition venue on competition days, as well as during scheduled training sessions. The Sport Information Desks will provide information on the competitions staged at the venue where it is located and will be in operation from the first day of training. Limited information of other disciplines will also be available.

The following information is available at the Sport Information Desk.

- Sport specific information for the competition held at the venue
- Limited specific information on other disciplines
- Official communication with teams
- Liaison among teams, competition management and the World Aquatics Technical
- Confirmation of times for training sessions
- Other miscellaneous enquiries

Operating hours for the Sport Information Desk will vary depending on the competition programme of each discipline. The SID is operated by sport-specific volunteers, and supervised by Competition Management.

Access to the SID will be given to accredited Team Officials only to ensure that information is communicated efficiently and effectively to all National Federations. Information on the Championships can also be obtained from the app "Sportity". This app can be downloaded from the following QR code. Password for the app is available at each venue.

2.3.7 Doping Control Table

The Doping Control Table is located near the exit of the FOP, with reserved seats for the proper staff. Before each games all credential of the players must be collected and placed to the designated table on the pooldeck.

2.3.8 Mixed Zone

All competitors must exit the field of play (FOP) through the Mixed Zone. The Mixed Zone is an area near the FOP that has been authorised for broadcasters or other media to conduct short interviews immediately after athletes have completed their events. The zone will be properly marked. Operations staff will manage the Mixed Zone and provide support for broadcasters and other media. The Player of the Game award will be presented also at this area, and pooldeck interviews with the coaches.

2.4 Championships Training

The water polo training schedule of World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023 has been prepared and training slots have been allocated in full accordance with the relevant World Aquatics rules and regulations, under the guidance of the World Aquatics.




2.5.3 Water Polo Caps

INSTRUCTIONS FOR WATER POLO CAPS World Aquatics Competitions 2023-24 (June 2023)

The caps must comply with the World Aquatics Competition Regulations (I. 8. 7. Water Polo Caps), e.g.:

VI (Water Polo Rules) Appendix 4. Water Polo Caps

- One (1) country code of a maximum height of 4cm on the front side of the cap.
- One (1) manufacturer's logo of a maximum size of 6cm on the front, back or side
- One (1) player number of a maximum height of 10cm on both sides of the cap
- One (1) country flag of a maximum height of 4cm on the back side of the cap
- One (1) sponsor logo (at the discretion of the NF) of a maximum size of 6cm2 on the back side



VI (Water Polo Rules) Appendix 4. CAPS


- 4.1 Caps shall be of contrasting color, other than solid red, as approved by the referees, but also to contrast with the color of the ball. A team may be required by the referees to wear white or blue caps. The goalkeepers shall wear red caps with numbers and/or ear guards in the same colour as their team members' caps. Caps shall be fastened under the chin. If a player loses the cap during play, the player shall replace it at the next appropriate stoppage of the game when the player's team is in possession of the ball. Caps shall be worn throughout the entire game.
- 4.2 Caps shall be fitted with malleable ear protectors which shall be the same color as the team's caps.
- 4.3 Caps shall be numbered on both sides with numbers 0.10 meters in height. The goalkeeper shall wear cap no. 1 and the other caps shall be numbered 2 to 13. A substitute goalkeeper shall wear a red cap numbered 13. A player shall not be allowed to change cap number during the game except with the permission of a referee and with notification to the secretary.

2.5 Competition Information

4.4 For international games, the caps shall display on the front the international three letter country code and may display the national flag. The country code shall be 0.04 metres in height.

CAP OF THE GOALKEEPER

The goalkeepers shall wear red caps with numbers and/or ear guards in the same colour as their team members' caps



Additionally, World Aquatics strongly recommends the following instructions: Team caps must be:

- -A team with white or light color caps should not include dark colors on the cap except for numbers and logos
- A team with a blue or dark color caps should not include light colors on the cap except for numbers and logos.
- The numbers must be of a clearly contrasting color to their base cap colors and clearly legible with standard calligraphy.
- -Goalkeeper caps must be at least 80% red. If they include other colors, these must be the same colors as their field player's caps.
- Field players caps cannot be in red for more than 20%.
- For club competitions in each CFs and NFs, the country's flag may be replaced by the team's logo without exceeding the measures allowed for the country's flag.
- In all cases, the caps must be approved by the delegates and referees at the technical meeting of each competition. As such, it will be essential to bring a team cap and a goalkeeper cap to the technical meeting for each tournament. If their caps are not approved, the team will have to wear white or blue caps, as the case may be.

Information

Set of caps

All participating teams are required to have available one (1) or two (2) additional sets of water polo caps, to be the same as one used in the competition.

2.5.4 Athletes Uniforms

Each athlete is expected to compete in the official National Federation team uniform throughout the Championships. All uniforms and personal equipment must be in compliance with the World Aquatics Competition Regulations as outlined in the I. Rules Applicable to all Aquatics Disciplines, 7. Swimwear and Wearables, and 8. Advertising Identification.

Athletes must wear their official National Federation robe for pre-game introduction.

Official NF tracksuit with appropriate footwear must be worn for medal ceremonies.

Women's Water Polo Competition

All participants must wear swimsuits/costumes (wide straps, high legs, zip back) with underwear beneath the suit. No other swimsuits/costumes will be permitted to be worn.

Before taking part in the game, players shall remove any articles likely to cause injury.

All participants must wear swimsuits/costumes of the same colour and design.

Men's Water Polo Competition

Players shall wear non-transparent costumes or costumes with a separate undergarment and before taking part in a game shall remove any articles likely to cause injury.

All participants must wear swimsuits/costumes of the same colour and design.

8.1 Advertising identification appearing on swimwear, pool deck equipment and official's uniforms at World Aquatics Championships and World Aquatics Competitions, with exception for World Aquatics Masters Championships, is permitted as mentioned under in this Section.

Where one-piece suits are used, two (2) logos of the manufacturer shall be permitted, one above the waist and one below the waist of a maximum size of 30cm² each when worn. These two (2) logos of the manufacturer shall not be placed immediately adjacent to each other. Where two-piece suits are used, the two (2) logos of the manufacturer shall be placed on one piece each.

The manufacturer's logo has to be calculated taking into consideration the entire surface of the logo, as shown below:





One (1) sponsor's logo of a maximum of 30cm² when worn.

One (1) flag and one (1) country name or code of a maximum size of 50cm² when worn. Repetitions of the national flag, elements thereof or, the colours of the national flag, included as a design element of the swimsuit, shall not be considered under this rule.

8.3 Wetsuits

The manufacturer's logo may appear on the front, and/or back, and/or sides of the wetsuit, of a maximum combined size of $80\,\mathrm{cm^2}$ when being worn. This manufacturer's logo space is allowed both on the inside and outside of the wetsuit. If the manufacturer wishes to have two or more logos on the front, back or sides, the combined total area must not exceed $80\,\mathrm{cm^2}$.

The size of the logo(s) shall be calculated taking into consideration the entire surface of the logo(s), as shown in the examples below:

One (1) sponsor's logo (may appear on the front of the wetsuit) of a maximum of 30cm² when being worn.

There must be a minimum clearance space of 1.5cm around all marks on the wetsuits, including any manufacturer's logo(s) and/or sponsor logo.

There shall be no marks or design/graphic elements on the upper arm or shoulder articulation area of the wetsuits, to allow for the clear application of the competitor race number.

8.4 Product Technology Identification

Where one-piece suits (swimsuits or wetsuits) are used in competition, two

(2) Product Technology Identifications shall be permitted, one above the waist and one below the waist, of a maximum size of 10 cm² each when worn, however these identifications shall not be placed immediately adjacent to each other, nor immediately adjacent to any manufacturer's logo. Where two-piece suits are used, one Product Technology Identification may be placed on each piece.

Other clothing: One additional identification allowed on clothing, limited to Product Technology Identifications, with a maximum size of 10 cm².

Product Technology Identifications means the technical identification (which shall not include any identification of the manufacturer, or any part thereof) used on clothing to identify any fabric technology.

8.9 Competitors Bibs

The maximum size of the Bibs shall be 24cm (width) x 20cm (height).

The height of the digits on the Bibs shall be no less than 6cm and no more than

The maximum height of the identification above the digits shall be 6cm. The identification may display the name/ World Aquatics Partner's logo.

The maximum height of the identification below the digits shall be 4cm. The identification may display the name/logo of the Host City and the year.

The Bibs shall be printed in suitable colours in order to ensure maximum visibility of the digits.

The Bibs must be worn fully visible during Competitors' introduction and award

A Competitor removing the Bib before being presented at the start of an event or before completion of the victory ceremony may be disqualified.

Only one World Aquatics Sponsor may be displayed on Bibs. However, there may be one sponsor for men and another for women at the same Championships.

2.5 Competition Information

8.9.1 Each competitor at World Aquatics Championships and World Aquatics competitions must wear on the chest over their tracksuit such advertising as supplied by World Aquatics when being introduced prior to the start of each event and during the victory ceremony.

8.10 Pool deck equipment

A maximum of two (2) advertising identifications of which one shall be of the manufacturer and the other one of a sponsor are permitted, with a maximum size of 40cm² each when worn for any of the

clothing items listed below, and a maximum size of 6cm² each for any of the accessories and equipment items listed below.

Identification on clothing must be placed on the top breast side so that Bibs requested by World Aquatics may be worn well visible below.

For upper-body clothing items only, the manufacturer's logo (being a design mark of maximum of 8cm in width) may additionally be displayed in the form of a strip in one of the following positions:

- a) around the bottom of both sleeves; or
- b) centered down the outer seam of both sleeves (from the collar across the top of the shoulders down to the bottom of the sleeve).




For lower-body clothing items only, the manufacturer's logo (being a design mark of maximum of 8cm in width) may additionally be displayed in the form of a strip centered down the outer seam of both legs (from the waistband down to the bottom of the leg).

- **8.12** Advertising for hard alcohol (greater than 15% alcohol), tobacco-based products, vapor-based smoking and sport gambling is prohibited. However, advertising for soft alcohol (less than 15% alcohol) and games of chance (e.g. state-sponsored lotteries) are allowed.
- 8.13 Any advertising identifications which are not indicated in these regulations are not permitted. In the event that any clothing or other items of equipment contravenes these regulations, the competitor must immediately remove the offending item(s) and replace it/them with clothing that complies with World Aquatics Rules. In the event that the breach is not immediately remedied the competitor may be requested to wear attire provided by the event organizer.
- **8.14** World Aquatics reserves the right to request Federations taking part in World Aquatics Championships and World Aquatics Competitions to present any advertising identification in this rule for examination and approval of World Aquatics prior to the event in question.

2.5.5 Participating Teams

16 men's and women's teams will compete at World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023. These teams qualify through a number of qualification tournaments held throughout 2021 to 2023.

2.5.6 Kinesiology Tape

The usage of Kinesiology Tape to assist and support musculoskeletal conditions is permitted, however to avoid the usage of different colour tapes only nude (skintone) colour tape.

Pre-Competition Procedures

2.6.1 Team Arrival at the Venue

Teams will enter the competition venue via their dedicated entrance from the bus drop-off point. Athletes and team officials must wear their accreditation card in order to access the competition venue. Without accreditation card, access will not be granted. Please ensure that accreditation cards are worn at all times in order to avoid any inconveniences and problems.

2.6.2 Accreditation Cards

The accreditation card contains all the information necessary to identify the owner, his/her role at the event and his/her privileges to access the competition venues and the restricted areas as well as his/her right to use the transportation service of World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023.

This Card is personal, nontransferable, must be displayed at all times while in zones requiring accreditation and is valid only in zones specified on this Card.

During games, players' accreditation cards will be placed on the World Aquatics Doping Control Table at the Field of Play, they shall be collected upon the conclusion of the game by the Team Manager of the athletes. Athletes must exit the FOP via the Mixed Zone with their accreditation cards.

2.6.3 Field of Play Protocol and Access Control

- The professional presentation of the Field of Play during the competition is of the utmost importance during the Championships. For this reason, only the staff and officials integral to the operation of the event will be permitted on or around the Field of Play. Similarly, no personal or non-essential equipment will be permitted on the pool deck during the competition.
- All athletes and team officials are asked to respect the need for a clear deck during
 the competition by ensuring only competing athletes are on the Field of Play. Access
 to the Field of Play will be strictly limited to persons with the correct accreditation,
 athletes and team officials are required to wear their accreditation cards at all times
 where appropriate.
- Further information relating to athlete and team official pathways during competition will be presented at the venue orientation and the Technical Meeting.

2.6.4 Athletes Introduction

All competitors are required to participate in the athletes' parade and introduction prior to the game.

Competitors will be escorted from the Call Room to the Field of Play where they will be introduced.

2.7.2 Arrival of the Teams at the Competition Venue

All teams are required to arrive at the competition venue 90 minutes before their game begins.

2.7.3 Call Rooms

- Reporting to the Call Room is required 12 minutes before the game begins, where
 the referees will proceed with the preliminary checks: start list, athlete's
 identification, WP caps, swim suits, finger nails, skin cleanliness, absence of any
 potentially harmful object.
- The Team Leader collects the Accreditation cards and gives them to the Doping Control Responsible at the reserved table.

2.7.4 Access to the Competition Venue

The access to the competition venue is allowed only for the 20 members of each team (15 Players, 2 Coaches, 1 Team Leader and 2 Physicians) with the appropriate accreditation cards.

2.7.5 Warm-up Pool

The access to the warm-up pool is allowed 60 minutes before the game begins. The warm-up area will be equipped with a regular Field of Play (one goal net per Team), 10 water polo balls per team.

Competition Procedures

2.7.6 On the Field of Play (FOP)

Teams enter the Field of Play immediately after the clearing of the pool deck from the Teams of the previous game from the Call Room upon the signal of the Sport Presentation Floor Manager.

2.7.7 Order of Entrance

The order of entrance and sport presentation procedure will be made in cooperation with the Sport Presentation Team and explained to teams at the Team Leader Meeting in detail.

2.7.8 Sports Presentation

The Fukuoka 2023 OC has appointed a sport production company to conduct sport presentation for the Championships. World Aquatics staff have been fully involved in the planning and delivery of all venues pertaining to Sport Presentation.

Sport Presentation involves:

- Announcers, Commentary & MCs
- All in-venue music and production
- Material displayed on the video board
- Medal Ceremony production and delivery
- Audience interaction
- Creating an atmosphere that builds the excitement for the spectators, as well as creating an environment that allows athletes to perform at their best.
- Keeping the competition on time and allow the sports to flow best for TV coverage.

2.7.9 Benches

Each bench will be equipped with a board with the name of the Country. On the back of the bench, there will be positioned a cart with a hanger for the robes of the players. An assistant will take care of switching the carts at the end of the 2nd period when the Teams switch bench.

A total of nine (9) persons only will be allowed on the team bench, namely three (3) officials and six (6) substitutes. A Medical Doctor and Physiotherapist will be allowed to be positioned adjacent to or behind the bench - actual positioning will be determined and advised during the Technical Meeting.

All officials must be attired similarly in official team uniform. Please note that shorts and/or sport uniforms will not be allowed.





Competition Procedures

2.7.10 Water Polo Equipment

Clothing and equipment worn or used by athletes and officials of World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023 must comply with World Aquatics Rules. Dress on the bench: all officials must be attired similarly in official team uniform. Please note that shorts and/or sports uniform will not be acceptable.

The World Aquatics official Mikasa water polo ball will be used, WP550C for men and WP440C for women, supplied for both training and competition by Mikasa.

2.7.11 Conclusion of the Game

- Athletes must collect all their gear from the FOP .
- All players and the Head Coach must pass through the Mixed Zone.
- The Team Leader must collect the accreditation cards from the doping control desk. as the desk is at the exit. the athletes should collect the cards.
- Doping Control representatives will notify players selected for doping control procedures to be followed.
- The World Aquatics will give notice in case that any disciplinary actions or player suspensions are to be applied as a result of an incident during the match.

2.7.12 Timing and Scoring and Results

World Aquatics Partner Omega will provide all timing, scoring and results services for the Championships.

2.7.13 Videotaping

Team videotaping is permitted from a designated area. This will be policed by staff. No other area will be set aside for videotaping. Positions are non-reservable and come strictly on a first-come basis daily. Access passes for the team videotaping zone will be distributed at the Technical Meeting (one for each team).

Post-Competition Procedures

2.8.1 Doping Control

Doping Control will be carried out during World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023 both on in-competition and out-of-competition basis, prior to and during the period of the Championships.

Any athlete participating in World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023 undergoes to testing in accordance with the World Aquatics DC Rules and the WADA International Standards.

The samples will be analysed in the WADA -accredited laboratory in Tokyo, Japan.

2.8.2 World Aquatics Bibs

Every competitor participating provided with a World Aquatics bib in the call room. The bib is to be worn on the chest over their tracksuit, just below the tracksuit logos. As per World Aquatics Competition Regulations, I. 8. 9., the bibs must be fully visible during athletes introduction and Medal ceremonies. Bibs will be distributed to the competitors when they report to the Call Room before the start of each final, and in the assembly area before medal ceremonies.

2.8.3 Medal Ceremonies

The Medal Ceremonies will be held at the competition venue. Following the presentation of medals and all player awards, the national anthem of the gold medalist will be played and the national flags of the medalists will be displayed. Upon completion of the anthem, athletes will participate in a parade around the Field of Play, where applicable. All finalists shall wear the World Aquatics bib, as provided by World Aquatics, on top of their National Federation uniform during the Medal Ceremony and lap until they leave the field of play arena. Athletes will be briefed about ceremony procedures in the assembly area. Athletes are reminded to attend all Medal Ceremonies in their official National Federation tracksuit with appropriate footwear. Not coming prepared with this full uniform will create delays in the TV coverage. Items such as flags, caps, mobile phones or any other symbols in addition to national kit and World Aquatics bibs are not allowed on the podium.

2.8.4 Press Conferences

- Persons who need to attend press conferences will be advised when to report for the conference so please make sure to attend.
- Non-English speaking athletes must be accompanied by interpreters because press conferences will be conducted in English.
- Press conferences will be held in the Marine Messe Hall A conference room located across from Marine Messe Hall B.

3.1 Accreditation

All National Federations participating in World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023 must complete the accreditation process in order to obtain the accreditation cards for their members. An accreditation card contains all the information necessary to identify its owner, his/her role at the event, and his/her access rights to the competition venues and restricted areas inside them, as well as his/her rights to use transport services at World Aquatics Championships - Fukuoka 2023. The card is personal and non-transferable. It must be presented at all times while in a zone requiring an accreditation card and is valid only in zones specified on the card.

Accreditation Centre

Starting on the 8th of July, 2023, the Accreditation Centre for athletes and officials will be operating on the 3rd floor of the Hakata Port International Terminal. In order to pick up accreditation cards, Team Leaders (or designated team representatives with written official authorisation) need to visit the Accreditation Centre in person to pick up the team's accreditation cards. Team Leaders (or designated representatives) are required to present ALL ORIGINAL IDENTITY DOCUMENTS (original passports used as identification in the GMS) of their team members.

All Athletes, Team Officials, and NF Representatives are also required to have a signed Declaration Form uploaded to their GMS profile at the time of accreditation card collection. Accreditation cards will not be distributed to those missing a signed Declaration Form.
