





Singapore 2025 efforts towards Sustainability

A Community-Led Recycling Effort

Trash to Treasure: Singapore 2025 turns recycled aluminium into World Aquatics Championships medals.

This is a novel initiative by the Singapore 2025 Organising Committee to collect approximately 100,000 aluminium cans to produce 5,000 medals. Students from five PCF Sparkletots Preschool Centres, eight primary schools, and three secondary schools are leading the charge in this effort through the School Recycling League. This programme encourages students to actively participate in recycling activities, fostering environmental responsibility from an early age.

Recycling Process

The collected aluminum cans will undergo open-loop recycling, where they're processed, cleaned, and smelted into medals.

Voices Behind the Movement

Mr Mark Chay, Co-Chair of the Singapore 2025
Organising Committee, highlighted the
significance of integrating sustainability into
major sporting events: "Sustainability is a key
consideration for organisers of large-scale
events as we strive to reduce our
environmental impact. The 'Trash to Treasure'
initiative demonstrates how simple, greener
habits can be seamlessly incorporated into
daily life while driving meaningful change. The
enthusiasm of students and schools in this
programme is truly inspiring and underscores
the power of collective action."

Fun Facts about the Medals

The medal weigh approximately 150 grams, incorporating recycled materials instead of new raw aluminum. Approximately 20 recycled cans were used to create each medal.

TOP TEAMS TO WATCH IN SINGAPORE

Water Polo (Men)

CROATIA



Won gold at the 2024 World Championships but were beaten by rivals Serbia in the gold medal match at Paris 2024. Head coach Ivica Tucak has led the team to gold at the 2017 and 2024 World Championships, silver at Rio 2016 and Paris 2024 Summer Olympics.

SERBIA



Won gold medals at the last three Olympic Games (2016, 2020, 2024). Team captain Nikola Jakšić is regarded as one of the top defenders in the world, leading them to finishing fourth at the 2023 World Championships.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



Only squad from outside of Europe to win a medal at the Olympics when they won bronze at Paris 2024. Their head coach Dejan Udovičić was the former head coach of the Serbian men's national team.

HUNGARY



One of the most successful teams in men's water polo with nine Olympic golds and four World Championships golds, most recently at Fukuoka 2023. Additionally they took home bronze at Paris 2024.

Water Polo (Women)

SPAIN



Won gold at Paris 2024, which was their first at the Olympics. They had finished as runners-up at Tokyo 2020, Fukuoka 2023 and third at Doha 2024. Their captain Pili Pena was part of the team that won silver at the 2012 London Olympics.

AUSTRALIA



Won silver at Paris 2024, which was their second best showing at the Games after winning gold at Sydney 2000. Australia's last gold medal at the World Championships was in Madrid in 1986. Their head coach Rebecca Rippon was part of the team that won the bronze medal at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

NETHERLANDS



Won their second world title at Fukuoka 2023 where Laura Aarts was named goalkeeper of the tournament. They've achieved bronze at Paris 2024 and gold at the 2024 European Championships.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



Won gold at Doha 2024 on the back of Morgan McDowall's tournament leading 31 goals and Ashleigh Johnson, considered to be currently the best goalkeeper in the sport. Finished fourth at Paris 2024.







Private hires serve as another option for transportation around the country. Input your card details into the apps or pay by cash upon reaching your destination.

Car Rental

If you are interested to explore Singapore at your own pace, renting a car is a viable alternative. To drive in Singapore, you will need an International Driving Permit along with your original driver's license. Several car rental companies operate in Singapore, many offering services right from Changi Airport.

Marina Bay Sands and ArtScience Museum





Currency

Language

The languages of Singapore are English, Mandarin Chinese, Malay and Tamil, with the lingua franca between Singaporeans being English, the de facto main language in daily, governmental, legal, trade and commercial affairs.

Among themselves, Singaporeans often speak Singlish, an English blend arising from centuries of melding between Singapore's multi-ethnic and multilingual society and its legacy of being a British colony.

Climate and **Time Zone**

Enjoy summer all year-round with Singapore's tropical climate (25-33 °C). Dress in light, airy clothing and bring along an umbrella in case of occasional rainfall. Singapore Standard Time is situated in GMT +8 time zone, so be sure to calibrate your watches accordingly.

Power Plug

The standard electrical current used in Singapore is 220-240 volts AC (50 cycles) and you may use power plugs with three square prongs here. It is recommended to check the compatibility of your devices with the voltage and plug types in Singapore before your trip. Some devices, such as laptops, smartphones, and camera chargers, are often compatible with a wide range of voltages and may only require a plug adapter.






