

### Main observations – 2025

#### Most attended event – Rostock (GER)

- > Along with Bolzano, the Rostock event has long been part of the World Aquatics calendar, having previously been included in the Diving Grand Prix series. Its central European location makes it easily accessible for many countries.
- > The timing of the event—held one month before the first Diving World Cup—was also convenient for teams, as it served as a final opportunity to qualify for the 2025 season.
- > However, positioning it as a qualifier for the same year's World Cup also presented challenges, given the short onemonth gap between the two competitions.

#### Four (4) continents hosted seven (7) Events

- Europe two (2)
- Americas two (2)
- Asia two (2)
- Oceania one (1)

#### **New Host-Hong Kong (HGK)**

- ➤ A new event has been added to the 2025 calendar the Hong Kong Open Diving Championships which has already been confirmed for renewal next year.
- > This addition introduced a second event in Asia, attracting participation from eight (8) National Federations.


#### Nine (9) World Aquatics Diving Recognised Events in 2026 (record)





## FINA Diving Grand Prix – former circuit


- > Launched in 1995 with 11 Grand Prix events
- > Average: **8.6 events** per year since inception
- > Peak seasons: **1999** & **2000 14 events** each
- > Lowest count: 2012 only 5 events held
- > Super Final Series: 1999-2003, served as circuit finale



#### Notes:

- 1. 2021 and 2022 data excluded, as the post-COVID period marked a transitional phase for the Grand Prix and FINA's rebranding to World Aquatics.
- 2. 2020 figures reflect the initially scheduled events announced at the start of the season, prior to cancellations caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- > 21 host countries since 1995
  - **Spain**: hosted every year (1995–2020)
  - Canada & Italy: 25 editions each
  - · Germany: 24 editions
- 2025: Spain, Canada, Italy & Germany all hosted World Aquatics Diving Recognised Events, demonstrating continuous commitment to diving and the Grand Prix legacy



Remaining hosting countries: Austria, Egypt, Great Britain, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, Malaysia, New Zealand, Puerto Rico, Singapore, Sweden and Thailand
