Additional Rules and Regulations

2026

Purpose of this Document: This document serves to supplement the World Aquatics Competition Regulations (the “Competition Regulations”) by specifying additional rules, regulations and technical components that are specific to the 2026 World Aquatics Diving World Cup (the “Event”). This document also offers further World Cup-specific operational guidance to support consistent application across all stops of the Event. Unless specified otherwise, all technical components referenced in this document can be found in the Competition Regulations. For the avoidance of doubt, if any conflict arises between these additional rules and regulations and the Competition Regulations, the Competition Regulations shall prevail.

1. PARTICIPATION, COMPETITION FORMAT & REGISTRATION

1.1 Participation

1.1.1 All World Aquatics Member Federations are eligible to participate at the Diving World Cup Stops 1 & 2 and the Super Final, except those under suspension.

1.2 Events

1.2.1 Medal Events (Stops 1 & 2 and Super Final):

A total of 9 medal events will be contested:

- Individual Diving (Men/Women):
 - 3m Springboard
 - 10m Platform
- Synchronised Diving (Men/Women):
 - 3m Springboard
 - 10m Platform
- Mixed Team Event

1.2.2 Event Breakdown:

- Individual: 4 events
 - Preliminaries and Finals for Stops 1 & 2
 - Head-to-Head Format for Super Final
- Synchronised: 4 events
 - Direct Finals
- Mixed Team: 1 event
 - Direct Final

1.3 Competition Schedule

1.3.1 Stops 1 & 2

- Duration: 4-day competition + 2 days of training
- A detailed daily schedule will be communicated in advance
- Medal ceremonies will be held after each session

1.3.2 Stop 3 – Super Final

- Duration: 3-day competition + 2 days training
- A detailed daily schedule will be communicated in advance
- Medal ceremonies will be held after each session

1.4 Conditions of Entry

1.4.1 Stops 1 & 2

1.4.1.1 Entry Limits:

- Individual Events: Maximum 2 divers per Federation
- Synchronised & Mixed Team Events: Max 1 team per Federation
- Mixed Team divers must also be entered in Individual or Synchronised Events

1.4.1.2 Qualification Standards:

Divers must meet minimum point standards from the following approved events:

- World Aquatics Championships – Singapore 2025
- World Aquatics Diving World Cup 2025:
 - Guadalajara, Mexico
 - Windsor, Canada
 - Beijing, China
- World Aquatics Diving Recognised Events 2025:
 - Auckland, New Zealand
 - Rostock, Germany
 - Gatineau, Canada
 - Morgantown, USA
 - Bolzano, Italy
 - Kowloon, Hong Kong China
 - Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia
- PanAm Aquatics Championships – Medellin 2025
- FISU World University Games – Berlin 2025

Note: Recognised Events in 2026 held before the Diving World Cup Stop 1 will not count towards qualification.

Refer to Appendix 1 for the point standards.

1.4.1.3 Exceeded Entry Quotas:

- If more than **30** entries in Individual Events or more than **12** teams in Synchronised Events are received:
 1. Priority is given to participants of:
 - World Aquatics Championships – Singapore 2025
 - World Aquatics Diving World Cup 2025
 2. If still over quota, final selections are made based on score points from the above events (in that priority order)

1.4.1.4 Host Country Privileges:

- Host Nations may enter up to 3 divers in each individual Event of Stops 1 & 2 only, regardless of qualification point standards
- Only top 2 divers from the host nation may advance to the Final (based on ranking)
- The 3rd diver is ineligible for ranking points
- No additional host entries are permitted in Synchronised or Mixed Team Events.

1.4.2 Super Final

1.4.2.1 Qualification Criteria:

- Individual Events: **Top 12** divers **by name** from combined series' Stops 1 & 2 results.
 - Max 2 per Federation per event
 - Participation in both Stops is required to qualify
- Synchronised & Mixed Team Events: **Top 8** teams **by nation** from combined Stops 1 & 2 results.
 - Participation in both Stops is not required to qualify

Refer to Appendix 2 for ranking points distribution.

1.4.2.2 Tie-break Procedure:

In the event of a tie in ranking points for Super Final qualification:

- Rankings will be determined using the cumulative scores from the series' Stops 1 and 2
- Only scores from the furthest level the divers progressed to (preliminary or final) will be considered
- This process ensures a maximum of 12 divers qualify for the Super Final in the Individual Events and 8 teams for the Synchronised Events

1.4.2.3 Host Country Privileges:

- Host Nation cannot add divers for Individual Events if not qualified
- Host Nation may enter 1 team in Synchronised and Mixed Team Events:
 - If not already qualified
 - Regardless of points standards
 - These entries will not be eligible for ranking or prize money

Note: For all Stops 1 & 2 and the Super Final, World Aquatics reserves the right to invite additional divers in the event of injury and to ensure continental representation and gender balance.

1.5 Competition Rounds

1.5.1 Stops 1 & 2

A. Individual Events

- Two preliminary rounds (split format)
- Preliminary start list determined via random draw
- Top 12 divers (from merged preliminary results) advance to finals
- In case of a tie to qualify for finals, all tied divers advance

B. Synchronised & Mixed Team Events

- Direct Finals
- Start list by random draw

1.5.2 Super Final

A. Individual Events

- The top 12 divers, based on combined rankings from Stops 1 and 2, will compete in a three-phase format:
 1. Head-to-Head
 2. Semifinal
 3. Final
- Matchups in the Head-to-Head round will follow a seeded format based on rankings (12th vs 1st, 11th vs 2nd, 10th vs 3rd, 9th vs 4th, 8th vs 5th, 7th vs 6th)

B. Synchronised & Mixed Team Events

- Top 8 teams
- Direct Final
- Start order: reversed order from combined rankings of Stops 1 & 2

1.5.3 Ranking Points

1.5.3.1 For Individual Events, divers placing 13th to 30th will receive ranking points based on their position in the preliminary phase. Divers finishing in the top 12 will earn additional points from the final, which are added to the points earned in the preliminaries.

Example:

If Diver A finishes 11th in the preliminaries, they receive 21 points. After advancing to the final and finishing 8th, they earn an additional 24 points, bringing their total to 45 ranking points.

1.5.3.2 For Synchronised and Mixed Team Events, ranking points are awarded based on the Final results.

1.5.3.3 No ranking points will be awarded for any phase from which a diver (or a team) withdraws, as all dives must be completed to qualify for ranking points. If a diver withdraws in the final of an individual event, they will keep the ranking points earned from the preliminary phase.

1.5.2.4 Ranking points are not awarded at the Super Final, since results are determined solely by performances during the Super Final itself.

Refer to Appendix 2 for ranking points distribution.

1.6 Registration, Entries & Team Leaders Meeting

1.6.1 Registration

- All participating Federations must register their delegations through the World Aquatics General Management System (GMS):
► <https://data.worldaquatics.org>
- Registrations must be completed by the deadlines specified by World Aquatics
- Only National Federations may register a delegation; individual or club registrations are not permitted

1.6.2 Entries

- All event entries must be submitted through the GMS by the established deadlines for each Stop
- It is the sole responsibility of each National Federation to:
 - Ensure accuracy of entry data
 - Verify Athlete eligibility and event compliance
 - Submit entries separately for each Stop in which they participate

1.6.3 Team Leaders Meeting

- World Aquatics will convene a mandatory Team Leaders Meeting 24 hours prior to the start of the first event at each Stop
- It is mandatory for one representative of each Federation to attend, failing to do so will result in a fine of one-hundred (100) U.S. Dollars (USD)
- The meeting will include:
 - The official competition draw for Stops 1 and 2
 - Final updates on schedules, protocols, and operations

1.6.4 Online Dive Sheets

The Water Sports Manager platform will be used to submit online dive sheets. Only one person per Federation will get credentials to submit dive sheets electronically on the Dive Sheets Manager.

World Aquatics staff will reach out to each Federation to obtain the contact responsible for the dive sheets. The designated person will receive an email from no-reply@stsoftware.com to log in on the website. They will then have the view of each event to enter their dive sheets. They will only see divers from their own National Federation entered in each event.

A complete list of dives for each competitor must be submitted 24 hours prior to the commencement of their preliminary event session, or final session if the event is a direct final. Each event will then be open until 24 hours before the Preliminaries or direct Finals as per the World Aquatics Competition Regulations.

All phases (Preliminaries and Finals) shall be completed and submitted. After submitting each dive sheet, the owner will get a confirmation email with the dive list.

2. SCORING

2.1 Judging Panels

- Individual & Mixed Team Events:
 - Judged by 7 judges
 - Scoring follows the official World Aquatics Competition Regulations
 - The Mixed Team Event is judged on overall impression for the 2 synchronised dives
- Synchronised Events:
 - Judged by 11 judges
 - Scoring follows the official World Aquatics Competition Regulations

3. PRIZE MONEY & TROPHY

3.1 Prize Money

3.1.1 Prize money will be distributed by the World Aquatics Office to each respective Federation following confirmation of anti-doping results by the International Testing Agency (ITA). This process typically takes place within a few weeks after the conclusion of each Stop. Once received, it is the responsibility of each Federation to allocate the prize money to the eligible Athletes.

3.1.2 In the event of a tie for any prize money position, the total amount allocated to the tied placements will be equally divided among the tied Athletes or teams.

3.1.3 Stops 1 & 2

Prize money is awarded to the top 3 finishers in each of the 9 medal events as follows:

3.1.2 Super Final

Prize money is awarded exclusively based on the results of the Super Final. World Aquatics will distribute Super Final prize money to the top 12 finishers in the Individual Events and to the top 8 teams in the Synchronised and Mixed Team Event.

3.2 World Aquatics Trophy

At the conclusion of the 2026 Diving World Cup Super Final, the best male and best female divers will have their names engraved on the World Aquatics Trophy. Each will also receive a personal token of recognition.

4. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

4.1 World Aquatics Delegates

World Aquatics Technical Delegates will oversee judging evaluations during the event.

4.2 Technical Officials

4.2.1 Referees and Assistant Referees

- Each Organising Committee must appoint at least:
 - 1 Referee
 - 1 Assistant Referee
- Officials must be Silver or Gold-level judges from the current [AQUA Officials List](#), subject to World Aquatics approval

4.2.2 Judge Quotas per Federation at Stops 1 & 2

- Each Federation may nominate up to 2 judges ([Bronze, Silver, or Gold](#))
- Federations entering 4 or more divers must provide at least 1 judge
 - Failure to do so will result in a USD 500 fine
- All nominations must be approved and registered in the GMS by the deadline

4.2.3 Judge Quotas at the Super Final

- World Aquatics appoints 15 Technical Officials for the Super Final
 - World Aquatics covers their flights and per diem
 - The Organising Committee covers accommodation, meals, and local transport

4.2.4 Conflict of Interest

All Technical Officials are required to submit a duly completed Conflict of Interest form prior to each Stop. If World Aquatics identifies any conflicts, appropriate actions may be taken.

5. ACCOMMODATION & MEALS

All participating National Federations are responsible for covering all expenses related to their delegation, including but not limited to:

- Flights
- Accommodation
- Meals

6. MEDICAL SERVICES

The Organising Committee will provide the following medical services:

- Appointment of a qualified Event Medical Officer/Doctor.
- Free medical services for all competitors and officials at the competition venue.
- First aid facilities at official hotels.
- An ambulance on standby at the competition and training venues.
- Designation of a local hospital and provision of local medical contacts (pharmacies, dentists, etc.).
- Dedicated massage rooms at official hotels and the competition venue.
- Ice bath facilities available at the competition venue
