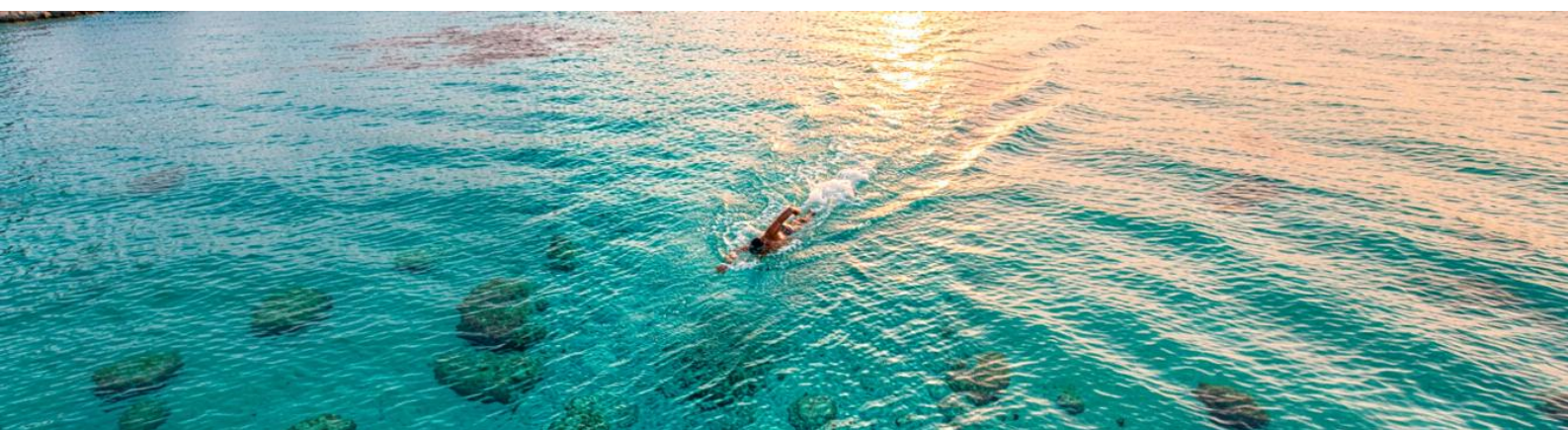

7. PARTICIPANTS

Entries will be accepted only from National World Aquatics Member Federations which must also register a team official for each respective competitor. A team official can be responsible for up to two (2) competitors only. The team official is responsible for representing their competitor(s) at the Team Leaders Meeting, and feeding the competitor during the event(s). A competitor without a coach present will not be allowed to start the race unless World Aquatics has been previously informed.

8. ENTRY PROCESS

All National Federation registrations and sport entries must be done through the World Aquatics General Management System (GMS) via <https://data.worldaquatics.com/> Each National Federation must complete their registrations before the designated deadlines.

The Team Leaders Meeting will take place on Thursday, 5 November. The venue and time are to be confirmed and will be communicated accordingly. At least one representative from each National Federation must attend this meeting.

12. ACCREDITATIONS & EVENT INFORMATION DESK

Accreditation

The Organising Committee will provide all competitors and Team Staff with an official Accreditation. Only accredited people will be allowed to access certain venue areas. All accredited people are requested to always carry their Accreditation with them and to show them upon request.

Accreditation will be delivered at the official hotels where the teams are accommodated. Delivery will be available from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. A dedicated accreditation desk will be set up next to the reception area, where team members may collect their accreditations once the check-in process has been completed.

It is important that accreditation is collected after completing the check-in process, as it must be carried at all times within the hotel premises to access the available services. Team Officials will be required to present photographic identification for all team members.

Information Desk

The official hotels will have an Information Desk available from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., providing support regarding competition details, transportation services, and general inquiries throughout the event.

13. MEDICAL

All Medical Support will be delivered by the local health authorities and in articulation with the World Aquatics Medical and Safety Officers, as well as World Aquatics Rules and Procedures.

14. VISA INFORMATION & TRANSPORTATION

Visa Information:

Citizens of certain countries and territories require a visa to enter or transit through Mexico. Please click [HERE](#) to check if you require a visa.

Note: Citizens holding a valid visa issued by Canada, the United States, Japan, the United Kingdom, or any country within the Schengen Area do not require a Mexican visa; however, they must complete the Mexican immigration form available at:

Upon request submitted to operaciones@aquaticsmex.com, the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) will provide visa assistance by issuing an invitation letter. Please note that, under the current circumstances, visa processing times may be longer than in previous years. Therefore, we strongly recommend starting this process as early as possible to avoid any travel issues due to potential delays.

Participants requiring visa assistance are encouraged to contact dir.operaciones@aquaticsmex.com as soon as possible.

All participants requiring a visa must be registered in the GMS with all the necessary information completed before the established deadline. The deadline to complete all GMS details in order to receive an invitation letter is October 6, 2026.

Please complete the registration process in GMS and send, by email, a copy of the passport identification page for all team members requiring visa assistance. Please note that submitting the passport identification page is a mandatory requirement requested by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Transportation:

Transfer services will be provided free of charge only for the National Federations arriving at the official airport - Cancún International Airport (CUN).

Local transportation between the Hotels and training/competition venue will be provided as well by the Organising Committee.

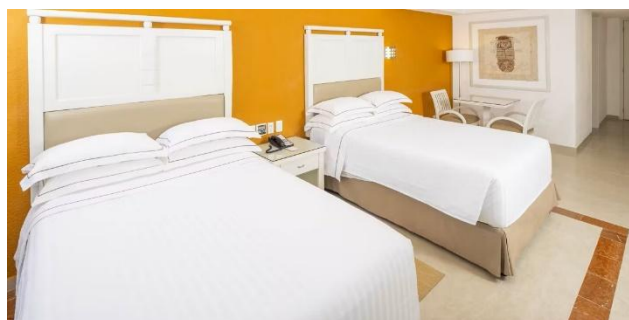

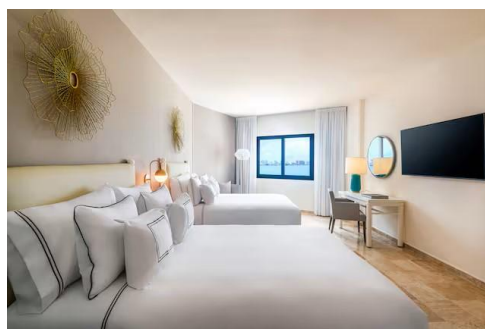

17. CANCELLATION POLICY

Any full cancellations **after October 6, 2026**, are subject to full payment of the total amount.

Please note that these payments are non-refundable due to hotel policies.

18. ANTI-DOPING

Urine and blood samples will be collected during the competition for the purpose of doping controls. The doping controls will be done in accordance with the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules and the World Anti-Doping International Standards, which can be consulted [here](#). The operations will be supervised and coordinated by the International Testing Agency (ITA).

The list of prohibited substances can be consulted [here](#). For reminder, all athletes are strictly responsible for any prohibited substance found in their sample and it is particularly important for them to check any medication they take against the prohibited list. Additionally, all athlete support personnel are responsible to be knowledgeable about anti-doping regulations and procedures.

Mandatory Anti-Doping education course prior to participation:

Athlete

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, any athlete participating in World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course “[International-Level Athletes Education Program](#)” or a course developed by their respective NADO and recognised by the AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit).* Any athlete who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to compete and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Team Official: Coach, Head Coach, Chef de Mission, Team Leader, or Support Staff

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, anyone registered as a team official—including coach, head coach, chef de mission, team leader, support staff—for World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course “[Coaches of High Performance Education Program](#)” or a course developed by their respective NADO and recognised by the AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit).* Anyone who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to participate and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Team Official: Doctor, Medical Professional, Massage Therapist, or Physiotherapist

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, anyone registered as a team official—including doctor, medical professional, massage therapist, physiotherapist—for World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course “[ADEL for Medical Professional's Education Program](#)” or a course developed by their respective NADO and recognised by the AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit).* Anyone who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to participate and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

* AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit) Recognised NADO Education Programs

Please refer to the list of anti-doping education programs from National Anti-Doping Organisations (NADOs) whose certifications are recognised by the AQIU [here](#). These certifications will be accepted as fulfilling the mandatory anti-doping education requirements for all World Aquatics competitions.

Steps to Complete the ADEL Certification

Please follow these instructions in order to complete the ADEL course:

Step 1:

Access the eLearning course webpage [here](#).

Step 2:

Click on “Register here” and follow the steps to register an account.

Step 3:

Sign in to the new account just created.

Step 4:

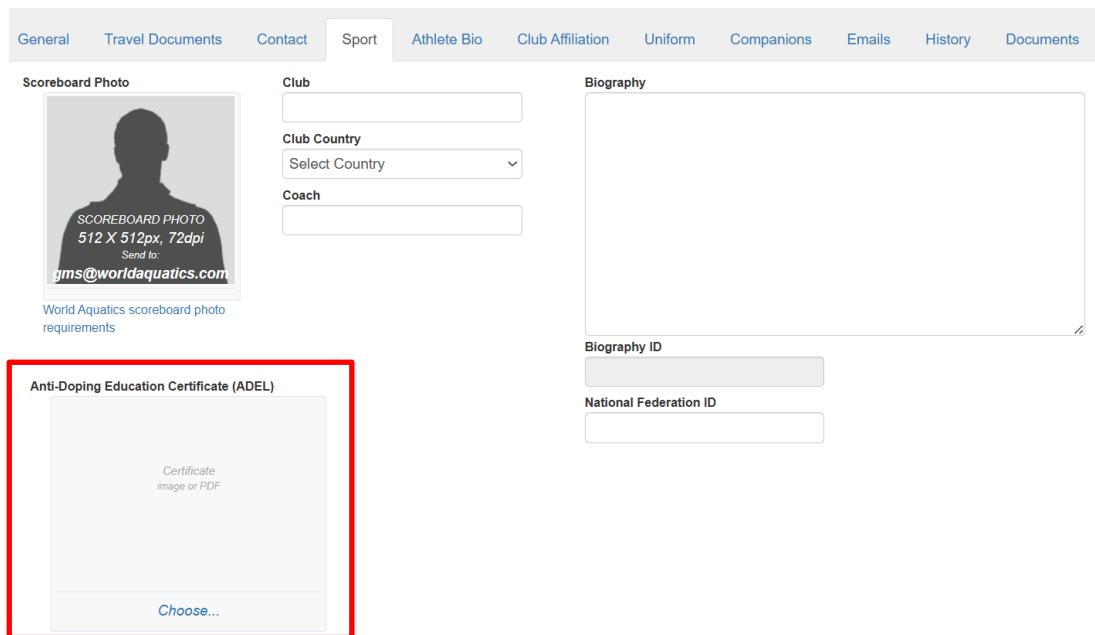
Based on the category, select the course “International-Level Athletes Education Program”, “Coaches of High-Performance Education Program” or “ADEL for Medical Professional’s Education Program” and complete the course to obtain at least 80% at the final exam at the end of the course. You can do the course again if you do not achieve 80% the first time. The athletes’ course is available in twenty-three languages, the coaches’ course in seventeen languages, and the medical professionals’ course is offered in three languages. Each course takes up to 2-3 hours to complete. The courses can also be accessed through the “ADEL by WADA” mobile application.

Step 5:

Once the course has been successfully completed, download the certificate of completion, and send it to your World Aquatics Member. The ADEL guidelines to download the certificate can be found [here](#). In case of any queries that may arise regarding downloading the certificate, you may also reach out to ADEL Helpdesk at [here](#).

Step 6:

The World Aquatics Member must upload the certificate of completion of each athlete on their respective GMS profile [here](#) (in the Sport tab).



Note: In order to avoid any issues, Members should not wait until their teams are finalised to inform their athletes and team officials about this requirement. Rather, they should ask all athletes and team officials who could potentially participate in the event to complete the course immediately.

Athletes and team officials are encouraged to renew their certifications every four years to stay up to date with the latest anti-doping regulations and procedures.

19. SAFEGUARDING

World Aquatics (AQUA) and AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit) are committed to strengthening safe, abuse free and respectful environments across all aquatics events.

Athletes and Team Officials (Coach, Head Coach, Chef de Mission, Team Leader, Support Staff, Doctor, Medical Professional, Massage Therapist, Physiotherapist, Media Liaison)

Anyone registered as an athlete or a team official—including coach, head coach, chef de mission, team leader, support staff, media liaison—for World Aquatics Events, is encouraged to complete the eLearning safeguarding course [Safeguarding Essentials \(Course 1\)](#) or a course recognised by the AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit)*, prior to participation at the Event.

Please refer to the Safeguarding Essentials (Course 1) [Registration Guide](#) to access the course. To receive the certificate, complete the course in full. The course takes approximately 1 hour to complete.

Note: From 1 January 2027, completion of this course will become mandatory for all participating athletes and team officials at all World Aquatics Events.

AQIU Recognised Safeguarding Courses

The AQIU recognises safeguarding courses offered at national level, provided that the course covers, at a minimum, the core areas included within Safeguarding Essentials (Course 1) and that a nominal certificate of completion is delivered afterwards. Member Federations are invited to complete the following [form](#) should they wish to have a course reviewed and recognised by the AQIU.
