The Olympic Aquatic Center is the leading aquatics facility in the Republic of Uzbekistan and the country's flagship sports venue. The center is located within the modern Olympic Village in Tashkent—a large-scale national project initiated by the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Shavkat Miromonovich Mirziyoyev, to create a world-class sports infrastructure in the country and train athletes for major international competitions. Construction of the Olympic Village was completed in 2025, after which the Aquatic Center was commissioned as the national training base for Uzbekistan's national teams.

Today, the Olympic Aquatic Center serves as a national training base for elite athletes and hosts major national and international competitions in swimming, diving, artistic swimming, and water polo.

Designed in full compliance with World Aquatics specifications, the complex includes a modern 50 x 25-meter competition pool with ten lanes, equipped with a high-tech electronic timing system, state-of-the-art sports lighting, and all the necessary infrastructure for hosting international competitions.

The complex also includes a specialized diving pool with diving boards and springboards, a separate warm-up and training pool, medical and rehabilitation units, athlete recovery areas, modern locker rooms, work areas for referees, media representatives, and organizational staff, as well as spectator stands designed to accommodate major international competitions.

The competition and warm-up pools are combined into a single functional complex, ensuring efficient logistics for athletes and officials and allowing for simultaneous competitions and training in full compliance with international standards. Additionally, the complex features spacious team training areas, conference rooms, technical facilities, and administrative infrastructure, creating optimal conditions for athletes, coaches, referees, media representatives, and organizing committees during high-level events.

3. ENTRY PROCESS

All entries shall be made electronically via the World Aquatics General Management System (GMS) through the respective Member Federations via the link <http://data.worldaquatics.com> by the deadline of **Tuesday, 15 September 2026, 23:59 GMT**. Access to the registration system should be via the login details previously supplied to each Member Federation. If you require any assistance or support with the registration process, please contact gms@worldaquatics.com.

For information regarding international club participation, please contact the World Aquatics Office at swc@worldaquatics.com.

The entry times will only be accepted if they have been completed within the qualifying period of fifteen (15) months prior to the entry deadline. No times outside of this qualifying period will be accepted. For 2026 edition, times achieved in both 25m-pool and 50m-pool will be accepted.

Qualifying period: Sunday, 14 June 2025 – Tuesday, 15 September 2026

Times achieved during the first stop of the 2026 Swimming World Cup will be considered for athletes participating in the Tashkent stop.

The minimum age for swimmers competing in the Swimming World Cup 2026 shall be at least 14 years of age on 31st December 2026 in accordance with [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#) (Part 2. Chapter 13. AGE GROUP RULES – SWIMMING).

4. TECHNICAL MEETING

Technical meeting will take place on **7 October 2026, at 11:00** in the venue. This will be the only opportunity for last-minute entry changes (any withdrawals, but additional entries only for duly entered members of national teams, but no additions for club swimmers).

It is mandatory for one representative of each Member Federation and international club to take part in the Technical Meeting. The competitors should be made aware of their responsibilities in attending the Swimming World Cup and being presented at the Technical Meeting. Failing to do so will result in a fine of one hundred (100) Swiss Francs per the World Aquatics Competition Regulations.

TRANSPORTATION & ACCOMMODATION

1. TRANSPORTATION

- Official airport: **Tashkent International Airport (TAS)** named after Islam Karimov (45 mins/25 km to venue)

Free transportation is only provided for athletes, coaches and accompanying persons having booked the official event hotel with the Organising Committee.

Transportation will be provided to and from the airport as well as between the official event hotel and the competition venue during the official trainings and the competition days.

For logistical purposes, please make sure to enter the CORRECT and UP-TO-DATE travel information in the World Aquatics GMS. The Organising Committee will organise transportation according to the travel details entered in the system by **15 September 2026**.

Please note that, for security purposes, vehicle access controls will be in place within the Olympic City sports complex. Accordingly, only authorised vehicles will be permitted to access the venue.

Participants arriving by private, rental, taxi, or other independently arranged vehicles are kindly advised that such vehicles will not be permitted to enter the sports complex without prior authorisation from the Organising Committee. Access will be granted only to vehicles with the appropriate authorisation.

Participants intending to access the sports complex using their own or other independently arranged vehicles are kindly requested to contact the Organising Committee (Khabibullaev Abdulaziz, uzbekistanaquatics@gmail.com) in advance to enquire about obtaining the necessary vehicle pass.

We kindly ask all participants to take this information into consideration when making their travel and accommodation arrangements.

2. ACCOMMODATION

3. VISA ASSISTANCE

Visas to foreign citizens issued at diplomatic missions and consular offices of the Republic of Uzbekistan abroad on the basis of a visa confirmation (confirmation of the Consular and Legal Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan).

A visa is issued on the basis of an invitation-application from legal entities and individuals permanently or temporarily registered in the territory of Uzbekistan, submitted to the Consular and Legal Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

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Note: If necessary, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan has the right to impose a restriction on obtaining an electronic entry visa for citizens of certain countries for up to 30 days.

If you are not covered by the visa-free regime agreement, you must obtain a visa before traveling to Uzbekistan.

The Uzbekistan Aquatics will assist in the preparation and submission of the required documents and will submit an application on behalf of the applicant to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Uzbekistan in order to obtain the necessary approval.

Required documents for visa processing:

4. Copy of passport
5. Passport-size photo

Passport requirements:

- The passport must be valid for at least 6 months after the expiration date of the visa
- The passport must contain at least two blank pages for visa stamps

Important:

Visa processing may take up to 7 working days.

Please plan your visit to the consulate or visa authorities in advance.

Visa issuance procedure

6. If there is an Embassy or Consulate of Uzbekistan in the applicant's country, the applicant must visit the consular office to finalize and obtain the visa after receiving approval from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Uzbekistan.
7. If there is no Embassy or Consulate of Uzbekistan in the applicant's country, the applicant may obtain a visa upon arrival at Tashkent International Airport (TAS), after receiving the necessary approval from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Uzbekistan.

MEDICAL SERVICES & DOPING CONTROL

1. MEDICAL SERVICES

The Organising Committee is committed to providing comprehensive medical services in accordance with the World Aquatics Medical Rules to protect the health and safety of all participants and minimise the risk of injury throughout the event.

Qualified healthcare professionals, including emergency medical personnel and nurses will be on duty during all official training sessions and competition periods.

1) Medical Services at the Competition Venue

A Medical Station will be established within the Olympic City Aquatic Centre and will operate throughout the official training and competition periods.

The Medical Station will provide:

First aid and emergency medical treatment.

Emergency ambulance services.

If further medical evaluation or specialised treatment is required, patients will be transported by ambulance to the designated event hospital upon the recommendation of the venue medical team.

2) Medical Services Outside the Competition Venue

In the event of an emergency, participants requiring hospital care will be transported by ambulance directly to the designated hospital under the supervision of the event medical team.

2. ANTI-DOPING

Urine and blood samples will be collected during the World Aquatics Swimming World Cup 2026 for the purpose of doping controls. The doping controls will be done in accordance with the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules and the World Anti-Doping International Standards, which can be consulted [here](#). The operations will be supervised and coordinated by the International Testing Agency (ITA).

The list of prohibited substances can be consulted [here](#). For reminder, all athletes are strictly responsible for any prohibited substance found in their sample and it is particularly important for them to check any medication they take against the prohibited list. Additionally, all athlete support personnel are responsible to be knowledgeable about anti-doping regulations and procedures.

2.1 Mandatory Anti-Doping education course prior to participation

Athlete

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, any athlete participating in World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course "[International-Level Athletes Education Program](#)" or an eLearning course developed and approved by their respective National Anti-Doping Organization that covers the same topics. Any athlete who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to compete and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Team Official: Coach, Head Coach, Chef de Mission, Team Leader, or Support Staff

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, anyone registered as a team official—including coach, head coach, chef de mission, team leader, support staff—for World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course "[Coaches of High Performance Education Program](#)" or an eLearning course developed and approved by their respective National Anti-Doping Organization that covers the same topics. Anyone who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to participate and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Team Official: Doctor, Medical Professional, Massage Therapist, or Physiotherapist

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, anyone registered as a team official—including doctor, medical professional, massage therapist, physiotherapist—for World Aquatics Events must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the eLearning Anti-Doping Education course "[ADEL for Medical Professional's Education Program](#)" or an eLearning course developed and approved by their respective National Anti-Doping Organization that covers the same topics. Anyone who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to participate and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Please follow these instructions in order to complete the course:

Step 1:

Access the eLearning course webpage [here](#).

Step 2:

Click on “Register here” and follow the steps to register an account.

Step 3:

Sign in to the new account just created.

Step 4:

Based on the category, select the course **“International-Level Athletes Education Program”**, **“Coaches of High-Performance Education Program”** or **“ADEL for Medical Professional’s Education Program”** and complete the course to obtain at least 80% at the final exam at the end of the course. You can do the course again if you do not achieve 80% the first time. The athletes’ course is available in twenty-three languages, the coaches’ course in seventeen languages, and the medical professionals’ course is offered in three languages. Each course takes up to 2-3 hours to complete. The courses can also be accessed through the **“ADEL by WADA”** mobile application.

Step 5:

Once the course has been successfully completed, download the certificate of completion, and send it to your World Aquatics Member. The ADEL guidelines to download the certificate can be found [here](#). In case of any queries that may arise regarding downloading the certificate, you may also reach out to ADEL Helpdesk at [here](#).

Step 6:

The World Aquatics Member must upload the certificate of completion of each athlete on their respective GMS profile [here](#) (in the Sport tab).

Club-Affiliated Athletes and Team Officials participating in the World Aquatics Swimming World Cup

Club-Affiliated Athletes and Team Officials must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the mandatory Anti-Doping Education course corresponding to their role. Certification of completion must be presented (hard or soft copy) at the accreditation centre in order to receive accreditation. Anyone who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to participate and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Note: In order to avoid any issues, Members should not wait until their teams are finalised to inform their athletes and team officials about this requirement. Rather, they should ask all athletes and team officials who could potentially participate in the event to complete the course immediately.

Athletes and team officials are encouraged to renew their certifications every four years to stay up to date with the latest anti-doping regulations and procedures.

2.2 World Records and World Junior Records

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, any Athlete equalling or breaking a World Record or World Junior Record in Swimming, shall be tested immediately after the race, or at the latest, 24 hours after the race. If not selected for doping control after the race, it is the sole responsibility of the athlete(s) to come to the doping control station to request being tested.

2.3 Continental or National Record

Should an Athlete equal or break a continental or a national record, it is the sole responsibility of the athlete(s) to check whether the rules of their Continental Organization or Members require a negative doping control in order to recognize the record. If this is required, the athlete must go to the doping control station to request a doping control test. This test will have to be paid by the athlete or their Member.

3. SAFEGUARDING

World Aquatics (AQUA) and AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit) are committed to strengthening safe, abuse free and respectful environments across all aquatic events.

Athletes and Team Officials (Coach, Head Coach, Chef de Mission, Team Leader, Support Staff, Doctor, Medical Professional, Massage Therapist, Physiotherapist, Media Liaison)

Anyone registered as an athlete or a team official—including coach, head coach, chef de mission, team leader, support staff, media liaison—for World Aquatics Events, is encouraged to complete the eLearning safeguarding course [Safeguarding Essentials \(Course 1\)](#) or a course recognised by the AQIU (Aquatics Integrity Unit)*, prior to participation at the Event.

Please refer to the Safeguarding Essentials (Course 1) [Registration Guide](#) to access the course. To receive the certificate, complete the course in full. The course takes approximately one (1) hour to complete.

Note: From 1 January 2027, completion of this course will become mandatory for all participating athletes and team officials at all World Aquatics Events.

AQIU Recognised Safeguarding Courses

The AQIU recognises safeguarding courses offered at national level, provided that the course covers, at a minimum, the core areas included within Safeguarding Essentials (Course 1) and that a nominal certificate of completion is delivered afterwards. Member Federations are invited to complete the following [form](#) should they wish to have a course reviewed and recognised by the AQIU.
