Diving Australia are pleased to announce the Australian Diving Cup, to be held on the Gold Coast, Australia from 3–5 December 2026.

The Australian Diving Cup will take place at the iconic Gold Coast Aquatic Centre, host venue of the 2018 Commonwealth Games.

This spectacular outdoor facility on Queensland's sunny coastline provides a world-class competition environment and a unique championship atmosphere. The event will serve as a key development opportunity for all athletes and an exciting international benchmark in the lead-up to the Olympic Games in 2028.

Diving Australia looks forward to welcoming nations and their teams, offering athletes, coaches and travelling members an outstanding competition experience in one of Australia's premier sporting destinations.

Member federations from across the world are invited to attend and enjoy our excellent competition and dryland training facilities. 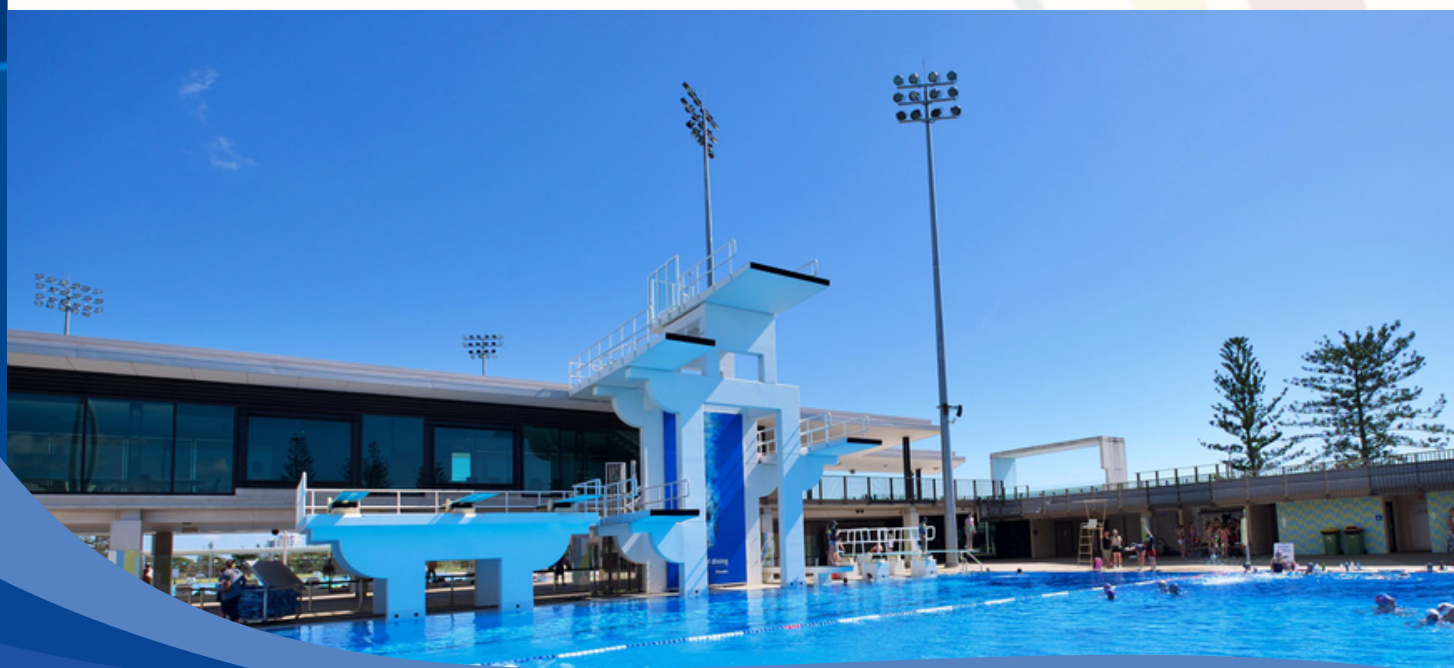
About the Gold Coast

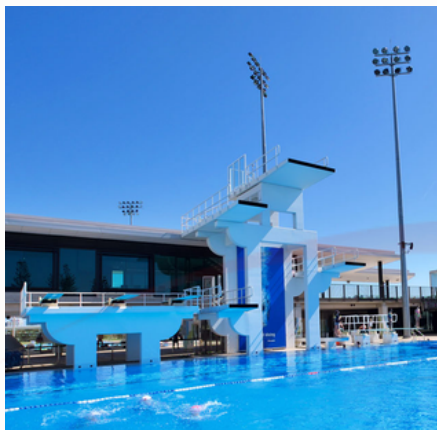

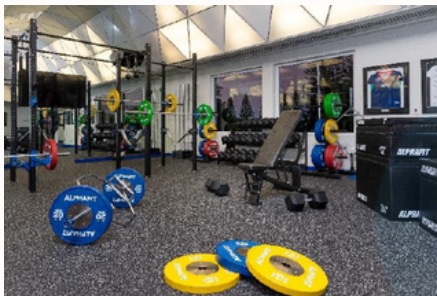

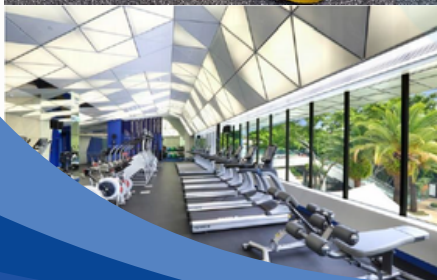

- To ensure the event has sufficient participants and to help with planning, we require early Expressions of Interest by form linked above.
- Team reservations will only be confirmed upon receipt of the 50% deposit and will be allocated on a first in basis.
- Cancellation dates and policies:
 - Any cancellations after October 3, 2026 are subject to a 50% cancellation fee.
 - Any cancellations after November 4, 2026 are subject to a 100% cancellation fee.



Travel information

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

All arrivals and departures must be done to and from Gold Coast airport (OOL) or Nerang train station (you can catch the airtrain from Brisbane airport to Nerang Station). Diving Australia volunteers will meet you at the airport or train station with your transport plans to the hotel.

VISA AND ETA PROCESS

When entering Australia, all travellers are required to carry a valid passport and, in most cases, a visa or an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA), depending on their nationality. If you need an invitation letter for your visa application, please reach out to the event manager for assistance.

As part of the entry process, every traveller must also complete an Incoming Passenger Card (IPC), which is provided during your flight or by the Australian Border Force upon arrival. This card collects important details such as your personal information, flight details, and customs declarations. Properly completing this card is essential, as it helps Australian authorities mitigate various risks to the country and ensures compliance with the country's strict biosecurity and immigration laws.

POOL TRANSFERS

Diving Australia will provide transport for all athletes, coaches and accompanying persons having booked the official event hotel with the LOC.

GETTING AROUND THE GOLD COAST

Getting around the Gold Coast is easy, with a variety of convenient transport options. The G light rail system runs along the coast, connecting key locations from Helensvale to Broadbeach, including Surfers Paradise. Buses are frequent and serve most areas, while taxis and rideshare services like Uber are readily available. For those who prefer flexibility, car rentals are popular, allowing easy access to both the beaches and hinterland. Cycling is also a great option, with scenic bike paths stretching along the coastline.

RULES AND FORMAT

The Australian Diving Cup will be conducted under AQUA diving rules. Click [HERE](#) to see the World Aquatics rules and format.

The Australian Diving Cup will consist of the following events:

- Individual - Men/ Women - 3 meter Springboard and 10 meter Platform
- Synchronised Diving - Men/Women - 3 meter Springboard and 10 meter Platform
- Team Event

PARTICIPATION

- The Australian Diving Cup is open to all World Aquatic Member Federations.
- Individual Events - Entries are limited to a maximum of six (6) participants per individual event per nation. These events will include a preliminary session, repechage and a final. Further details are below.
- Synchronised Events - Entries are limited to a maximum of two (2) teams per synchronised event per nation. These events will consist of a finals round only.
- Team Event - Entries are limited to a maximum of one (1) team per nation, excluding the host national which is limited to a maximum of two (2) teams.

JUDGES

Each team to provide a World Aquatics Bronze or higher qualified judge with teams of four or more.

World Aquatics, following the recommendation of the World Aquatics TDC, will appoint a delegate for this event. The World Aquatics Delegate will conduct judging evaluations that will count towards the Diving Technical Officials Pathway, available [HERE](#).

Competition Format

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

3M and 10M events for both men (6 dives without limit) and women (5 dives without limit) will be contested. These events will include a preliminary session, a repechage round, and a final.

PRELIMINARY	ADVANCED SESSIONS	
	REPECHAGE	FINAL
Entries are limited to a maximum of six (6) participants per individual event per nation. A maximum of 2 divers per nation can automatically qualify for the final from the prelims.	From the preliminary, divers ranked 9th to 20th, regardless of nationality, will qualify for the repechage session. Athletes displaced from Top-8 in the prelims due to the nationality quota will be part of the 12 divers in the repechage. The Top 4 divers from the repechage, regardless of nationality, will earn qualification to the final, resulting in a 12-person final.	From the preliminary, the Top 8 divers (with a maximum of 2 per nation), and the Top 4 divers from the repechage (regardless of nationality) will be included in the final. Each final will include a total of 12 athletes. Should any qualified athlete withdraw from the final, the next best ranked diver from the repechage will be allocated their spot, regardless of nationality. Medals will be awarded to the Top 3 divers, regardless of nationality.

Competition Package

The competition package includes accommodation, 3 meals per day, transport and competition entry fees. All divers, support team and officials are required to register for the competition package.

Meals will include 3 meals per day starting with dinner on arrival day and finishing with breakfast on departure day. All breakfast and dinners will be at RACV Royal Pines Resort, lunch will be a mix of at the pool and hotel.
